AFTER-SCHOOL TUTORING, STUDY HALL & HOMEWORK HELP

Cal students and ELP staff provide 1 to1 and small group tutoring supervised by our ELP Academic Liaison. Services are offered based on parent request or school day teacher referral as needed. During Study Hall students can work on their homework in a calm, supervised setting with a staff member available to answer questions or check answers. Tutors review school subjects and provide practice in language arts and math during 30-60 minute sessions.
